RICHLAND COUNTY COMMUNITY PARTNERS RESPOND TO PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

Richland Center, WI: A virtual Emergency Operations Center meeting was held again

this morning to share information between Richland County officials and community

Public Health Manager/Local Health Officer Rose Kohout announced that as of 2:00pm

in the state of Wisconsin there were 1,351 confirmed cases for COVID-19, 17,375 have

tested negative, and there were 16 deaths related to COVID-19. There remain 2

confirmed cases of COVID-19 within Richland County at this time and Public Health

staff continue to monitor those individuals and investigate potential exposure. Kohout

encouraged Richland County citizens to maintain social distancing and stay home if

possible, as we have to assume the virus is everywhere.
