## RICHLAND COUNTY COMMUNITY PARTNERS RESPOND TO PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

*Richland Center, WI*: A virtual Emergency Operations Center meeting was held this morning to share information between Richland County officials and community partners in a joint response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Public Health Manager/Local Health Officer, Rose Kohout announced that as of 2:00pm Wednesday, August 12<sup>th</sup> the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) confirmed that in the state of Wisconsin there were 62,263 confirmed cases of COVID-19, 1,023,723 have tested negative, there were 1,111 deaths, and 5,125 hospitalizations due to COVID-19. Of those that tested positive for COVID-19 in the state of Wisconsin, 8% have been hospitalized. There are now 37 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Richland County, 10 individuals remain in quarantine, 2,986 have tested negative, there have been 4 deaths, and 23 individuals who had tested positive have been released from quarantine. Of those 37 individuals who tested positive, 4 were hospitalized and the remaining 33 individuals have been recovering at home.

The Richland Hospital Clinic campus continues to offer voluntary medical procedures and Primary Care visits, while also continuing to offer Tele-Health patient visits. Richland Hospital Clinic patients needing hands-on medical care should call the hospital main number (608) 647-6321 or clinic main number (608) 647-6161 before coming to the facility. Anyone entering the facility will be asked to wear a mask. If possible, please bring your own mask with you.

Richland County Administrator, Clinton Langreck reported that there are changes being proposed to the county's COVID-19 Plan which include the following impacts to the public: the requirement of face coverings to be worn during in-person public meetings and the ability to offer routine teleconferencing for public meetings.

UW-Platteville/Richland, the Richland School District, and the Ithaca School District continue to review all considerations for safely and successfully reopening schools for the 2020-21 school year amid the COVID-19 pandemic.
