RICHLAND COUNTY COMMUNITY PARTNERS RESPOND TO PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

Richland Center, WI: A virtual Emergency Operations Center meeting was held this

morning to share information between Richland County officials and community partners

in a joint response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Public Health Manager/Local Health Officer, Rose Kohout announced that as of 2:00pm

Monday, January 4th the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) confirmed that

in the state of Wisconsin there were 508,346 confirmed cases of COVID-19, 2,405,734

have tested negative, there were 5,162 deaths, and 22,434 hospitalizations due to

COVID-19. Of those that tested positive for COVID-19 in the state of Wisconsin, 4%

have been hospitalized.

Emergency Operations partners have decided to offer more up-to-date local data on the

condition of our county that might not match the numbers offered by the State. Public

Health Manager/Local Health Officer, Rose Kohout announced that as of 8:00am

Tuesday, January 12th there are 1,171 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Richland County

and 7,985 have tested negative. Of those 1,171 individuals who tested positive, 1,158

individuals have been recovering at home, 66 have been hospitalized at some point, and there were 13 COVID-19 related deaths. Kohout noted that the number of active cases has been corrected by Health and Human Services to reflect old cases that had been removed from isolation but that were not previously subtracted from the active case data. The oversight occurred early on when Health and Human Services first began releasing active case data and was recently discovered. Kohout and Health and Human Services Director, Tracy Thorsen apologize for this inadvertent error. Richland County Public Health now has 68 active cases and 319 individuals who had tested positive have been released from quarantine.

A collaborative partnership has been established between the Richland Hospital, Richland County Health & Human Services, Richland County Emergency Management, and Center Pharmacy to develop a local plan to effectively and efficiently distribute COVID-19 vaccinations as they become available. This group continues to meet weekly to clarify the details of the local plan.

FREE COVID-19 community testing events continue in Richland County. The University of Wisconsin-Platteville Richland is offering FREE COVID-19 testing events on WEDNESDAYS (1/13 & 1/20) from 9am-3pm in the Classroom Building located on the Richland Center campus. All participants must register for this testing event at www.DoINeedaCOVID19Test.com. Drive-thru community testing events are offered weekly on MONDAYS from 9am-Noon (or until all tests are administered) and THURSDAYS from 9am-3pm at the Richland County Fairgrounds. Appointments

are not required, but it is requested that those who wish to be tested pre-register at https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov. Tests will be available on a FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVE basis.
