RICHLAND COUNTY COMMUNITY PARTNERS REVIEW WEEKLY COVID-19 VACCINATION & TESTING EFFORTS

Richland Center, WI: A virtual Emergency Operations Center (EOC) meeting was held on September 2nd to share information between Richland County officials and community partners in a joint response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Public Health Manager/Local Health Officer, Rose Kohout announced that as of 2:00pm Wednesday, September 1st the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) confirmed that in the state of Wisconsin there were 663,132 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 7,627 COVID-19 related deaths. In Richland County, Kohout announced that there were 1,446 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 8,545 have tested negative as of September 2nd. Richland County Public Health now has 57 active cases and 100 individuals have been hospitalized at some point. Kohout noted “the DHS website increased the COVID-19 related deaths in Richland County from 16 to 18; however, there were no recent COVID-19 related deaths reported from the Richland County Coroner’s Office. It is likely that DHS recently received new information on previous COVID-19 related deaths and reassigned them appropriately”.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services reports that as of today 53% of Richland County residents have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine and 50.2% are fully vaccinated. Richland County citizens age 65 and older who have received at least

The following updates were announced regarding COVID-19 vaccinations, testing, and booster vaccinations availability in the county:

COVID-19 VACCINATIONS & ADDITIONAL DOSES

Populations who are now “currently eligible” to receive the vaccine includes ALL WISCONSINITES 12+. Certain immunocompromised people are recommended and eligible to get an additional dose of Pfizer (ages 12+) or Moderna (ages 18+) COVID-19 vaccine following a completed series. The following partners are offering vaccine clinics in Richland County:

Tuesdays from 8:30-10:30am
Fridays from 8am-5pm

Currently eligible populations will also be offered a vaccine during hospital or clinic appointments. To schedule an appointment, please call 608-647-1820.

- **The Spring Green Medical Center and Muscoda Health Center** offers Walk-In COVID-19 vaccinations and also offers vaccines during clinic appointments.

COVID-19 TESTING

The following partners are currently offering COVID-19 testing in Richland County:

- **The Richland Hospital and Clinic** offers Walk-In COVID-19 testing to symptomatic individuals or those who have been exposed to COVID-19 only. To schedule an appointment, please call 608-647-1820.
- **The Center Pharmacy** offers COVID-19 testing to asymptomatic individuals (preferred) from 9-11am daily. To schedule an appointment, please call 608-647-8918.
- **Richland County Health & Human Services and Emergency Management** will offer FREE Drive-thru COVID-19 PCR testing to anyone, regardless of symptoms or residency, and will test individuals 1 year of age or older.
