RICHLAND COUNTY COMMUNITY PARTNERS REVIEW WEEKLY COVID-19 VACCINATION & TESTING EFFORTS

Richland Center, WI: A virtual Emergency Operations Center (EOC) meeting was held

today to share information between Richland County officials and community partners in

a joint response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Public Health Manager/Local Health

Officer, Rose Kohout announced that as of 2:00pm Wednesday, November 3rd the

Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) confirmed that in the state of Wisconsin

there were 799,174 confirmed cases of COVID-19 and 8,554 COVID-19 related deaths.

In Richland County, Kohout announced that there were 2,156 confirmed cases of

COVID-19, 9,633 have tested negative, and there were 26 COVID-19 related deaths.

Richland County Public Health now has 134 active cases and 142 individuals have been

hospitalized at some point.

Emergency Management Director, Darin Gudgeon announced the number of individuals

tested at COVID-19 community testing events held weekly at the Richland County

Fairgrounds. On October 28th 28 individuals were tested and another 33 individuals were

tested on November 1st. The results of those 61 tests will be included in the appropriate

county's totals once they are received and verified.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services reports that as of today 55.4% of Richland County residents have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine and 53.3% are fully vaccinated. Richland County citizens age 65 and older who have received at least one dose totals 81.6%.
