FREE COVID-19 TESTING ENDS IN RICHLAND COUNTY HHS OFFERS BIVALENT BOOSTER

Richland Center, WI: Richland County Emergency Management Director, Darin Gudgeon announced that FREE COVID-19 drive-thru community testing events WILL NOT BE REINSTATED as originally anticipated. Gudgeon reports "the community testing program now requires that test sites use rapid antigen tests, which are the same tests that individuals can take at home. With the shift in policy, we are now focusing on the distribution of at home antigen test kits to the citizens of Richland County."

Richland County Public Health Officer, Rose Kohout noted that FREE COVID-19 vaccination clinics will continue to be held at Richland County Health & Human Services, 221 W. Seminary Street, Richland Center on WEDNESDAYS from 1-4:30pm. Kohout announced "we are now able to offer the single (1) dose Pfizer-BioNTech Bivalent booster product, or updated boosters, as are now being recommended by the CDC and DHS." Appointments are preferred, but walk-ins are welcome for ADULTS ONLY. Appointments are required and a parent needs to be present for children 6 months-17 years requesting vaccination. Individuals should call Health and Human Services at 608-649-5795 to schedule an appointment.
